What is your name?

Yee Ging Wo.

What is your business?

I am in the general merchandise business.

At what number?

840 Clay St., firm of Kow Kee Jan & Co.

How long have you been a member of that firm?

When did you first come to the United States?

In K. S. 2nd year.

Were you a merchant at the time of registration?

Yes, I have been a merchant ever since I have been here. A

Who did you come here to testify about to-day?

Yee Jock Leong, my son.

Whose photograph is that?

A That is my son, Yee Jock Leong.

Is that your photograph?

Yes.

You are sure that is your boy, are you?

Yes.

How old is that boy?

He is 20 years old.

Can you give me the exact date of his birth?

He was born in K. S. 10th year, 1st month, 15th day.

Where was he born?

741 Sacramento St. A

On what floor of that building was he born?

A On the 2nd floor.

How many times have you been married?

A Only once.

What is your wife's name?

Wong Shee.

Q Is she living now?

A Yes.

Where?

She is living in China in the Sun Ning District. Lee Yin Village.

Is she a bound or natural foot woman?

She is natural footed.

Is she a heavy, stout woman or a slim woman? She is neither stout nor slim.

Neither stout nor slim?

No, she is about like I am.

Has she any scars or physical peculiarities about her face that you remember?

A No.

When your son was born here at 741 Sacramento St. did you have a shaving celebration?

Yes. A

Where did you hold that celebration?

In the Hom Fa Lau restaurant.

Do you know any white people in this town that know that your son was born here?

There are no white persons who know it.

How many times have you been to China?

Twice.

- When did you first go to China?
- A In K. S. 12th year.
- Q Do you know what month and day and what steamer you went on?
- A The 9th month on the "Gaelic."
- Q When did you return from that trip?
- A In K. S. 13th year in the 9th month on the "Gaelic."
- Q When you went to China in K. S. 12th did you take your son with you?
- A Yes, I took my wife and son.
- Q How old was your son then?
- A 3 years old.
- Q How many children have you?
- A I have two sons and one daughter.
- Q What is your younger boy's name?
- A He is 12 years of age.
- Q What is his name?
- A Yee Suey Leong.
- Q What is your daughter's name and how old is she?
- A Yee Yah Yit is her name; she is ten years old.
- Q Is she a bound or natural foot girl?
- A She is a natural footed girl.
- Q When you went to China on your second trip give me the exact date that you left this country, on what vessel and under what name?
- A I left here K. S. 16th year, 10th month, 26th day on the "Gaelic," under the name of Yee Ging Wo.
- Q You are sure of that statement, are you?
- A Yes.
- Q When did you return from that trip?
- A K. S. 21st year.
- Q What month and day did you land in this country and from what steamer?
- A I returned from that trip in K. S. 21st year, the latter part of the 4th month on the "China."
- Q Who does your elder son live with in China?
- A He lived in China with his mother, sister and his brother.
- Q What village?
- A Lee Yin Village.
- Q Is there any one else lives in that house with your immediate family?
- A Only my family.
- Q What alley is that house situated on?
- A It is on the second alley.
- Q You are sure of that statement, are you?
- A Yes, it is the second alley.
- Q How many houses from the corner is that house?
- A It is the third house from the corner.
- Q How many rooms in that house?
- A 5 rooms.
- Q What are they?
- A 2 bedrooms, 2 kitchens and a sitting room!
- Q Is there a river near that village?
- A There is a small river near there.
- Q Is the river in front or rear of the village?
- A It is in front of the village.
- Q Are there any hills near that village?
- A Yes.
- Q Are they in the front or rear of the village?
- A They are in the rear of the village.
- Q Who lives in the next house to your house on the right as you come out?
- A Soo Ho Shee, a woman.

- Q How long has she lived in that house?
- A She has lived there about as long as I have.
- Q Is she married?
- A Her husband has been dead a long time.
- Q What was his name, do you know?
- A, Yee Foon; Yee Jung Toong is his marriage name.
- Q Who lives on the other side of your house?
- A There was no house there when I was in China.
- Q Is there a market place in that village?
- A No.
- Q What is the nearest market place and how far is it?
- A Gong Mei market place, about two blocks.
- Q What is the name of the other witness in this case?
- A Ow Yung You.
- Q Did you ever see your boy in China?
- A Yes.
- Q When he went to China did you send anything to your boy or wife by this man?
- A No.
- Q Did you ever send anything by anybody else?
- A Yee Me Jung took some money for me to them.
- Q Have you understood all questions asked you by Mr. Rickards, the Interpreter?
- A Yes.
- Q What do you base your son's right to come in this country on, being a Merchant's Son or a Native?
- A On the grounds of his being a Native.
- Q Isn't he a Merchant's Son also?
- A Yes; I intend to have him come here to study English and learn to transact business.
- Q What interest have you in that store of Kow Kee Jan & Co. at 840 Clay St.?
- A \$1,000.00 interest.
- Q Ds your name on the partnership list of that firm?
- A Yes.
- Q What position do you occupy in that store?
- A I am buyer and salesman.
- Q Who is the manager of the store?
- A Yim Kew.
